

# HKU-CS Online Tech Forum and Discussion: *the Consultation Paper on Cyber-Dependent Crimes and Jurisdictional Issues*

## Background

The Consultation Paper on Cyber-Dependent Crimes and Jurisdictional Issues was published by the Cybercrime Sub-committee of the Law Reform Commission on July 20, 2022. The purpose of the consultation paper is to make preliminary proposals for law reform on addressing the issues of the protection of individuals' rights as well as the criminal activities carried out by the rapid developments of information technology, the computer and the internet.

## Why this Tech Forum and Discussion

The five cyber-dependent crimes mentioned in the consultancy paper will have impacts on both the industry (the practitioners) and the educators in the area of cyber security. One of the major purposes of the forum is to provide a platform for the stakeholders to provide comments, views, opinions and/or concerns on this consultancy paper and discuss further how to get a good balance between stopping cyber-dependent crimes while allowing the industry and the universities to nurture our next generations of white hackers for the community.
